## Words from the Pastor

Dear Church of the 49ers Family,

The Church of the 49ers is involved in many areas and ways to answer God's call to minister in our community. The outcome of these ministries determines our church growth and, most importantly, the growth of God's Kingdom; therefore, it is *significant*. It is an awesome honor and privilege to be involved in something with such far-reaching-positive impact. ## From the Pastor

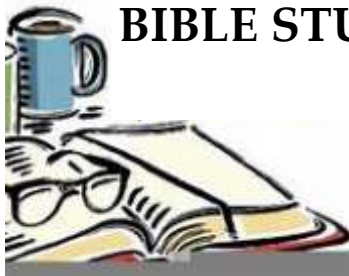



# BOOK REVIEW

## THE LAST SUPPER ON THE MOON:

NASA'S 1969 LUNAR  
VOYAGE, JESUS CHRIST'S  
BLOODY DEATH, AND THE  
FANTASTIC QUEST TO  
CONQUER INNER SPACE

Levi Lusko's "The Last Supper on the Moon" (W Group/Thomas Nelson, 2022) promised this blast off of a book is "Not an end but a beginning. A beginning to a new way to be human. A fresh way to be you—as you were intended to be and are capable of becoming." This is a thoroughly researched Apollo 11 mission to go to the moon as envisioned by President John F. Kennedy in his address to the joint session of Congress on May 25, 1961, "I believe this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to the earth."

Lusko describes his compelling book in his own colorful language, as "a little like a Christian-living book had a baby with a history book—the Frankenstein love child of Max Lucado and David McCullough." I think his writing style is more Max Lucado than the purely historical McCullough.

He adds aspects of the space program as a metaphorical enhancement of the major themes surrounding Jesus' dying on the cross while adding the seven last words of Jesus on the cross, the seven "I AMs" in the book of John, and the seven letters to the churches in the book of Revelation.

His quotes are memorable: From Mark Twain, "Everyone is a moon, and has a dark side which he never shows to anybody." Other Lusko quotes from the same chapter:

- *The craters and chasms and canyons of your character give texture and color and complexity that sparkle in your heavenly Father's eyes.*
- *Your shape and size and personality type and spiritual gifts and life experiences all have been carefully calibrated and crafted to create your calling.*
- *God didn't make a mistake when he fearfully and wonderfully made you in his image.*

Here is one example of how Lusko brings it all together—Did you know that Abraham Lincoln had a hand in the space program? In the 1860s, he made the final decision on the width of the train tracks for the transcontinental railroad of 4' 8 ½", the same as the East Coast railroad system, which matched the width of train lines in England, retrofitted from preexisting roads built by the Romans throughout the empire.

How does this connect to the Space program? Parts of the Apollo space

craft, and later the shuttle, were built in Utah and had to be transported to Florida by railroad, and could be no wider than what could be transported on the four feet, eight-and-a-half-inch width of the train tracks.

This unusual fact ties into one of Jesus' great "I AMs" from John 14:6, "I am the way [road], the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Thomas expressed his doubts, "Lord, we do not know where You are going, and how can we know the way?" Lusko says, "Thomas's superpower wasn't that he had doubts (like I said, that's all of us) but that he was honest about them. Those doubts prompted Jesus to say, "I AM the Way . . ."

One look at Levi Lusko's 375-page love letter to Jesus and the Apollo 11 crew, "The last Supper on the Moon," appears like a daunting read, but it's like eating an elephant, one chapter at a time. After reading each one, you will have to rest and think about the powerful message before you reset to the next awesome chapter.

In reference to Buzz Aldrin's taking the Lord's Supper after the Eagle landed on the moon, and before Neil Armstrong performed his "one small step for man," Lusko says, "The Last Supper didn't end anything; it began everything. You have a clean slate, a fresh start, and a new heart. No weapon formed against you can prosper (Isaiah 54:17).

Kennedy never saw the completion of the vision he set for America, to land on the moon and return home safely. But when Buzz Aldrin, Neil Armstrong and Michael Collins returned to earth safely, a mysterious flower arrangement appeared on John F. Kennedy's grave site with the note, "The Eagle has landed."

## September Session Highlights

Pastor Keith and Co-Clerk Karla Reid are importing church membership information into ChurchTrac software. Once completed, the information will be easily maintained and useful.

October is Stewardship Month, so pledge cards will be available in the pews for everyone to use. Our goal is to receive pledges to match our expected budget of \$225,000.

Betty Egan (Building and Grounds) is trying to get the heating and cooling repaired in Faith Hall and the room used by Nancy’s Hope. All locks will be rekeyed to make one master key limited to 4 people. However, keys to a particular room can still be checked out from the office.

Due to improper fire storage, three groups that have been paying minimal user fees for storage have been asked to terminate their use of 49er Church facilities at the end of their contracts. This will allow Christian Education to expand into those spaces eventually, as the number of children attending Sunday School is increasing. Christian Education does need another preschool volunteer.

Jon Whited stated that the church is growing, and finances are improving. Fire alarms are working, and the fire inspection is complete. The solar installation is waiting on parts. Recent improvements to the church facilities may reduce our combined insurance costs.

The Outreach Committee (Missions & Evangelism) will be meeting October 17 in Faith Hall at 3:30pm. The History Committee met in August, and they are working on articles for the Golden Nugget.
